WELCOME TO LONDON HASH HOUSE HARRIERS

Cos' we wish you all to have a good time and 'cos some of you won't open this mag till you go home. So here is a short potted history of London H3.

London was inaugurated on Monday 5th April 1976 by Ian McGregor, ex-pat from Hong Kong, with 5 runners starting from a house in N6 to run around a badly laid trail in Highgate Woods. Since that date London has flourished and in its heyday during the summer months the pack could total up to 130 hashers. However, down-downs were not introduced to the hash till 1984. The tradition of Monday evening runs in the summer with alternate Saturday/Sunday in winter still continues.

In the eighties the London hash started to travel to other hash events in the UK and around the world. It really made its presence felt at Interhash in Bali 1988 when Hooray Henry won the downdown competition. He subsequently contested his title at Manila. Phillipines 1990, Phuket, Thailand 1992. After three wins he retired and married. Since 1986 at Pataya Interhash a contingent of London hash can be seen with their red bus t-shirts at interhashs, Eurohashs, Americas Interhash, Pan America hashs, etc. The list is endless.

London's talents have been displayed in the thespian manner with four different pantomimes over the years. London hash has been twice on national TV, once in 1994 and the second time in 1999. Both times with Ryde, the organiser of this bash, when she was GM.

On the social scene there have been bowling evenings, quiz nights, hash balls, plus several hash marriages, which in turn has produced a large pack of horrors.

In September 1994 London hosted their 1000^{th} weekend with 415 hashers enjoying the countryside and amenities around the scout camp at Gilwell Park, Epping Forest.

London hash does make its mark on serious running by having a beer table at the 22-mile stretch of the London Marathon to distribute beer to participating hashers. One year a London hasher willingly drank out of his new shoes after 22 miles of hard slog and with 4 miles still to go.

So if you have read this article before the event enjoy yourselves. If after the event hope you enjoyed it. Finally a big thank-you to the hares, committee members and everyone associated with London over the past 25 years. Not forgetting the pubs that the hash has frequented over the years.



Not to be outdone the girls thought they would have a go at organising a girlie hash where men were welcome but had to be honorary females for the night. The organisers were Thunder Thighs, Jane 'Squeek' McDonnell, Karen 'One hung Lo' Ziprin and Yvonne 'Knickers' Rice-Oxley. The runs were held fortnightly on a Wednesday with the inaugural run being held on 1 February 1989 at Green Park with 37 runners. Rumour had it that on that run the Queen's limousine drove past the pack in the Mall, hence the 'Royal' connection. Sadly, as the months wore on apathy ruled but so did regular Wednesday tube strikes and numbers dwindled. The Demise Run at Waterloo on 31 January 1990 was hared by Prince and Menstrual. Shortly after about a dozen regulars had a meal down Brick Lane on the profits but the records show that Spunky still owes a fiver for a T Shirt.

Phil 'Myrtle' Mertell started CH3 in 1989 running on Tuesdays. Over the years a lot of fun has been made of the group calling it the Crap Hash (cockney rhyming City with Shitty) but it is currently the most well attended hash group in the London area.

ONce upON a time the London Hash, indeed like all other hash groups in the early 80's had no way of communicating information on then rare hash week-ends other than by 'flyers'. These 'flyers' would be sent around the world by and to ON Secs. In the mid to late 80's, however, hashers began travelling to 'away dos' in greater numbers and there became a need for some kind of world wide list. As ON Sec for London for many years and thereby being the recipient of many a 'flyer' and having access to a (work's) photocopier, together with Vaseline Val Clayton I began the first London Hash Magazine. I was paste up artist and copier whilst Val did the typing. As well as the list of hash week-ends it contained photos of amusing extracts from newspapers etc and adverts. I recall placing an ad for a man to put up a light in my new house. Meal Ticket (then London now Basle) did the job nicely!

Eventually the magazine was taken over by Pope, Hooray Henry, Little John and a variety of others until the early 90's when the Fleet Street big boys came along. By this time West London H3 has started so we had two magazines both trying to rival the other. Menstrual for WLH3 and IBM for LH3 were the duellists both vying for a bigger and better edition until one day Eureka! IBM produced a colour supplement, an amazing feat at the time.

Their rivalry went on for years with IBM's magazine containing the infamous 'Far Be It From Me' column. The reporter remained secret (although it has since been revealed to becensored) and the column contained all the hash gossip either true or concocted.

Eventually, however as women and beer began to take over Menstrual and IBM's lives (though not necessarily in that order) like all good things they came to an end. The world wide web took over and gossip has never been the same since.

DAVE 'HASH HORN' SMITH - d.1993

Dave ran with the hash from it's early days. He was a hash stalwart haring many a run and was our only memorable true hash horn. He married Jo 'Her Lordsmith' Lord and had a daughter Laura.

CHARLIE 'HASH LETCH' MEE - d.Early 90's
Charlie ran regularly with London all through the 80's.
One could only admire the man for running at his
advanced age but he was reknowned for taking photos
of and kissing girls; hence his hash name which was even
emblazoned on his 100th run mug. Charlie was a member
of a Scottish country dance group which hosted outside
dances in Paternoster Square in the City; some of us
used to go along for a laugh and see Charlie dancing in

his kilt.



DONALD 'MEGACHAP' MILLICHAP - d.1996 Don ran with London during the 80's and early 90's. Although a regular hasher he was a quiet guy who kept in the background.

VINCE 'HAIRY FAIRY' CULLING - d.2000


Vince, a native New Zealander, had been running with London for 10 years and was loved by all who met him. He got the name 'Hairy Fairy' after appearing in a London hash pantomime as a fairy performing a pas de quatre wearing a tu-tu, braces and bovver boots. Vince tragically died on Christmas Day having slipped on Ben Nevis whilst on a walking holiday. His memorial fund is in excess of £2000. A bench and tree are planned in the restoration of an overgrown Italian style garden in Gunnersbury Park in his memory. Some money is also to be sent to the Mountain Rescue Team.


